Tsuboe Gokujou OROSHIGANE -hako-

The grater is made of 1.5mm-thick stainless steel, which is both durable and easy to maintain. In addition to the sharp blade, a quattro blade is used to eliminate stress when grating. In addition, claws are provided at the top and bottom to prevent the blade from coming off the container when grating.

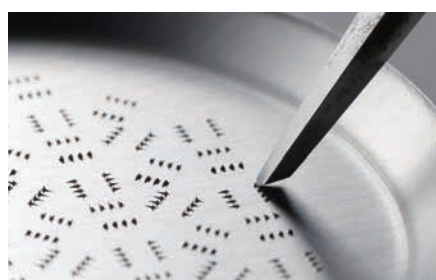
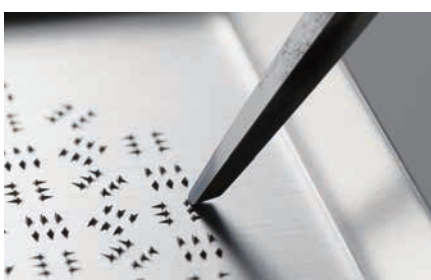

The blade of Honmetate grater is usually used a two direction blade. After many trials, we reached a conclusion that a eight direction (dual quattro) blade is the best for ginger and wasabi grating. You can enjoy smooth usability.

Grated condiments can be easily gathered.
Collecting condiments
 It is convenient for collecting grated condiments such as grated radish, garlic, ginger, wasabi, and yuzu etc.
Squeezing condiments juice
 After collecting the ginger, you can easily squeeze out the ginger juice by pressing it with a brush.
Scrapping condiments
 It is also convenient for scraping out a ingredient.

Brush sponge for grater



This is designed to be used for various purposes like cleaning up each part of grater and washing strainer, tableware and vegetables etc.
Brush face: For washing grater, strainer, vegetables etc.
Sponge face: For washing with detergent.
Compressed sponge face: For cleaning grater.

Refinement of techniques 115 years Tsuboe History



Originally, it was in 1907(40th year of the Meiji era) that the founder Kotaro Kasahara began a business as a file manufacturer. We gradually converted from hand operations to a mechanized system to improve mass production and as we moved on to our grater OROSHIGANE from files. As we enthusiastically work to preserve and pass down the techniques for future generations while constantly improving, the range of our products expanded from the tools to daily utensils. We will always strive to explore new challenges with the spirit of manufacturing.

Pride for Honmetate (sharpening files by handcraft work)

We practice Honmetate, which is the sharpening of blades one by one with a chisel. Through many trials, we managed to replicate the Honmetate techniques and accuracy through developing our original NC machine in cooperation with a machinery company. Honmetate techniques, with sharp and complicated blade alignment play an important role to produce 「Tsuboe no Gokujo OROSHIGANE」. Our best techniques for OROSHIGANE were born with these Honmetate techniques.
