

addiCraSyTrio

The flexible needle set addiCraSyTrio is a revolution in sock knitting. The trio consists of 3 needles each with two tips and a flexible middle part. 2 needles hold your stitches and the 3rd needle is used for knitting.

The short version (21 cm) is particularly suitable for smaller hands and socks. The long version (30 cm) for all those who like to have longer needles in their hands and who need more space, for example for an fleegle heel, two parallel knitted socks, hats or sleeves etc.

Who is addiCraSyTrio particularly suitable for?

- » For beginners who are not comfortable with using 5-double pointed needles or have little experience.
- » For loose knitters as the needles do not slip out off the knitted piece as easily as double pointed needles.
- For pattern knitters because fewer needle changes make it easier to manage your pattern.
- For knitters with hand problems because the long needles are easier to grip and do not slip out of your knitting so quickly, even if your hands are numb or painful.

Double pointed needles

Double pointed needles, also known as "sock knitting needles", are a set of 5 needles with 2 tips each. The knitting work is divided onto 4 needles and the 5th needle is used for knitting.

Double pointed needles are available in different lengths from 10-40 cm, so that knitting projects with different diameters can be worked such as socks, hats or sleeves.

Who are double pointed needles particularly suitable for?

- » For dpn professionals who easily handle 5 needles
- » For those on a budget because a standard set of needles is not as expensive to produce as, for example,
- the addiCraSyTrio and therefore significantly cheaper.
- » For tight knitters as it is easy to slide the stitches on evenly thick needles.



addiSockwonder

This small circular knitting needle is extra short - 25 cm measured from tip to tip. The special feature: one needle tip is 45 mm long and the other 70 mm. Thanks to the different lengths, it is possible to knit very small rounds such as socks.

The short needle is only held - the stitches are knitted with the long needle. Socks can be knitted in rounds without changing needles.

Who is the addiSockwonder best for?

- » For knitters with small hands they can hold the short needle tips well.
- » For fast knitters no interruption of the knitting flow by changing needles
- » For pattern lovers ideal for all patterns, whether large or small, uneven or offset stitches

Knit socks with various knitting needles

Instruction, needle guide & size charts for classic Top-Down socks with 4-ply and 6-ply sock yarn.





Knitting classic socks:

Here is a quick guide to knitting a classic top-down sock from the cuff to the toe, with classic heel and rounded toe. Materials:

- » 4- or 6-ply yarn suitable for socks
- Double pointed needles, addiCraSyTrio, addiSockwonder or 1-2 circular knitting needles in the right needle size for the yarn
- » Darning needle, scissors

In this instruction, we explain how to knit a sock starting from the cuff to the toe. Our instruction can be knitted with all sock needles, whether double pointed needles, addiCra-SyTrio, Sockwonder or circular knitting needles.

There are two versions online for toes and heels, as well as explanations on how to use the different knitting needle types. In these instruction we only describe the classic rounded toe and the classic flap and gusset heel.

1. Cuff

Cast on the desired number of stitches and knit a cuff of your choice (e.g., knit 2, purl 2) to your preferred length.

2. Leg

Work stockinette stitch (knit in rounds) until the leg reaches the desired length.

3. Classic heel

For the classic heel, divide the stitches into 2 halves:

- » Knit the 1st half stockinette leave the second half on a spare needle. Now work in rows on one needle.
- » Work the number of rows required for the heel (according to the chart) in stockinette with 2 garter stitches Right side: knit all. Wrong side: knit the first and last 2 stitches and purl the stitches in between.

The heel is formed with a heel flap. You will find 3 numbers in the chart for the heel, e.g. 10/12/10. They indicate the stitch division for the heel flap.

Right side: knit the first and the second third except for the last stitch, knit 2 stitches together by slipping (or ssk), turn. **Wrong side:** purl until 1 stitch before the end of the second third, purl 2 stitches together, turn. Repeat both rows until only the stitches in the middle remain.

4. Gusset

Work in rounds again. Pick up the indicated number of stitches from the garter stitch edge of the heel flap on both sides (1 stitch in the knot for every 2 rows).

- » Work decreases in the following rounds between the transition of the picked up stitches of the heel flap and the held stitches that were left on your spare needle (knit 2 together and ssk). Continue knitting round in stockinette stitch according to the chart.
- » Continue until the original number of stitches is reached.



5. Foot

Knit stockinette in rounds until the foot length up to the start of the toe is reached (see chart).

6. Rounded Toe

Divide the stitches in half again (upper foot & sole).

- In the following, work decreases in rounds by knitting together stitches on the right and left of the toes (knit 2 stitches together before and ssk after the transition of foot and sole).
- » Knit stockinette and decrease rounds alternating according to the chart in every 4th, 3rd, 2nd and every round.

7. Finishing

Sew remaining stitches together with kitchener stitch. Weave in ends. Wash the sock and stretch it slightly if necessary.

Remember to adapt these instructions to your stitch gauge and foot size with the help of our sock charts. Have fun knitting socks!
