Warning labels are an extremely important information tool to help users identify potential hazards and take appropriate precautions.

BENEFITS OF USING WARNING LABELS:

- + Compliance with standards and legal requirements




Examples of warning labels include:

- **Chemical labels** – inform about the dangers of specific chemicals, such as poisonous, flammable, corrosive, or irritant substances.
- **Medical product labels** – inform about potential risks associated with the use of medical products or devices.
- **Labels on agricultural chemicals** – used on chemical products, such as pesticides or fertilisers.
- **Labels on electronic products** – mainly inform about the risk of electric shock or other hazards associated with the use of the device.
- **Food packaging labels** – these labels are to provide information on allergens, sugar or artificial sweetener content, and to warn against the consumption of raw products or the required heat treatment.

Applications for the above labels include:

- Safety of use
- Risk awareness
- Proper use and handling
- Health and environmental protection
- Elimination of risk
