All began with an urgent need of social responsibility in the 80s were a lot of people from the Andes escaped the cruel terrorism and settled down in Lima. Even before RAYMISA was established Linda and Orlando implemented several social and artistic projects to promote Peruvian Folk Art. Until now RAYMISA is supporting handmade products by Peruvian artisans.

For already more than 30 years we market a wide range of products –high quality knitwear made out of alpaca yarn but as well home décor and folk art. We employ 25 people and work closely with workshops in all over Peru supporting these with initial aid and the development of their products.







Chulucanas

Created in the town of Chulucanas in the north of Peru this type of pottery is famous for their unique technique that has been maintained by artisans for thousands of years from their ancestors of prehispanic Vicus culture. Each item is hand thrown on the wheel, dried and polished with a stone to make a smooth finish.











































NATURAL FIBERS

Baskets are made in the north and south of Lima, Peru with locally sourced natural fiber called Junco (Seagrass). It is a sustainable material, extracted from lagoons or wetland near the weavers.

The artisans dedicated to this task are mostly women who learned this technique from their ancestor's. We want to share with the world their cultural traditions and empower them to support their families.























GOURD CARVING

The carved gourd or called mates in Peru is an ancestral tradition, where the artisans represent their culture and beliefs of the Andean communities on the gourd. They are part of the Peruvian artistic expression.

At present there is great versatility in its beautiful production and thanks to the creativity of artisans, various contemporary expressions are seen in each of them.











Painted Glass

Reverse painted glass is a handmade technique that keeps alive through the creation of new products that are carefully made to offer a high quality product.
